

Skills Assessment Explanatory Notes and Application Form

To submit a skills assessment application, the applicant must first be registered with an Australian Veterinary Registration Board.

This application is for assessment of veterinary science qualifications immediately acceptable to Veterinary Registration Boards in Australia (for migration purposes) with optional assessment of work experience and/or a further qualification (PhD).

Important – please read the following explanatory notes carefully before completing the application form at the end of the document.

Information for intending migrants

To migrate to Australia under a points tested skilled migration category one of the requirements is to nominate an occupation from the list of eligible skilled occupations which fits your skills and qualifications, and have your skills and qualifications assessed by the relevant assessing authority.

If your nominated occupation is “veterinarian”, AVBC is the relevant assessing authority and you should use this form to apply for an assessment of your skills and qualifications to determine if they are suitable for the occupation of veterinarian for migration purposes. This form should also be used if you require an assessment of further qualifications (a PhD) and/or work experience.

Please note that under immigration law, you will need to apply for this assessment whether your qualifications were gained overseas or from an Australian tertiary institution.

You should only apply for an assessment if, according to the AVBC website (www.avbc.asn.au) your qualifications fall into the category of qualifications immediately acceptable to Veterinary Registration Boards. AVBC is the only relevant assessing authority for migration purposes which, following an assessment process, can issue you with an assessment statement required by the immigration authorities.

If you have already been issued with a skills assessment and are applying for a skills assessment qualification and/or work experience up-date, you need to complete a separate form (available from AVBC).

Please note that AVBC does not provide information about how to migrate to Australia.

Completing the form

- Answer all questions in English, unless otherwise requested.
- Initial and date any alterations to the form.

AVBC reserves the right to request applicants to provide translations completed by an accredited translator in Australia by the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters (NAATI).

Certification

It is essential that copies of documents are certified. A copy has to be clearly authorised as a true copy of the original by an appropriate person.

Persons who may certify documents include Justices of the Peace (JP), legal practitioners, admissions officers of all Australian universities and officers of State and Territory Government Overseas Qualifications Units. A person listed as able to sign a statutory declaration is generally acceptable to the AVBC to certify a document <http://www.ag.gov.au/Publications/Pages/Statutorydeclarationsignatorylist.aspx>. To have your copies certified you will need to present both the original and the copy of each document to the person certifying the copies.

Each copy of the document must be certified separately and must show clearly:

- the words “certified true copy of the original”;
- the signature of the certifying officer; and
- the name and address and provider/registration number (where applicable) of the certifying officer legibly printed below the signature. It must be possible, from the details provided, for AVBC to contact the certifying officer if necessary.

Statutory Declarations

It is important that certified copies of documents be provided wherever possible.

A Statutory Declaration may in certain circumstances be accepted in place of some or all of the required documents. Statutory Declaration forms may be purchased at most newsagents (in Australia), or downloaded from State and Commonwealth government websites.

The information on the Statutory Declaration form should duplicate that which would have been available from your educational documents and must include the name and address of your educational institution in your own language and in English; the name of the degree, diploma or other qualifications; the subjects you studied each semester or year and the marks you received (to the best of your recollection); and the reason why certified copies of your original documents were unavailable.

You must forward the original Statutory Declaration duly witnessed by a person listed at the back of the Statutory Declaration form together with your application form.

Review of Assessment

Should you disagree with the assessment provided, you may request a review. Your request must be in writing and a review fee will be required. Your request for a review should include the reasons why you disagree with the assessment and any supplementary information or documents that you consider supports your claim. For further information about the review process you should contact the AVBC Executive Director.

Agents

AVBC normally deals directly with applicants seeking an assessment of their overseas qualifications. Australia’s privacy legislation prohibits AVBC from discussing your application with other people (third party) unless you authorise us to do so. If you want someone, such as a family member or migration agent, to deal with AVBC on your behalf, you need to attach a letter or form signed by you authorising this person (by name) to act as your agent.

Time taken for assessment

An assessment of your qualifications may take up to six weeks to process. Please bear in mind that mail to and from overseas countries is sometimes very slow.

You must provide evidence that you have achieved, in a single sitting, a score of band 7 or higher in each section of the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) **academic** test, or that you have passed each section of the Occupational English Test (OET) with a B pass or higher, or gained scores in the TOEFL-iBT of at least 24 in Listening, 24 in Reading, 27 in Writing and 23 in Speaking, or a score of at least 65 in each section of the PTE academic. The currency of an English language test is two years.

- evidence of attainment of NAVLE, ECFVG, PAVE or RCVS membership by examination (where applicable);
- evidence of your original and current overseas registration or licence to practice (where applicable);
- evidence of your current registration in Australia;
- evidence of a pass, in a single sitting, in the academic module of IELTS with a minimum score of band 7 in each section or a B pass in each section of the OET or a score of at least 24 in listening, 24 in reading, 27 in writing and 23 in speaking for the TOEFL-iBT or a score of at least 65 in each section of the PTE academic (if not a native speaker of English born and educated in the UK, Ireland, Canada, USA, NZ or South Africa). This also applies to graduates from Australian Veterinary Schools;
- evidence of change of name (if applicable);
- official translation in English of any documents originally issued in a language other than English;
- relevant colour copied pages from your passport or travel document showing passport number, photograph and signature. If your passport photo does not include your signature you need to provide a colour copy of other photo ID that does.
- if you are utilising the services of a migration agent, please provide permission for the Agent to act on your behalf such as an 'Authority to Act' form;
- a colour passport photograph taken in the past 12 months endorsed by a person able to certify documents with "This is a true photo of (applicant's full name)" and the certifying person's signature.

If you wish to have further veterinary qualifications (PhD) and/or work experience assessed for the allocation of points for a points based visa then you must also include the relevant documents with this application as described in the following Section F.

SECTION F Assessment of professional employment experience and/or PhD (If applicable)

Provide the following **only** if you want work experience and/or a PhD qualification assessed.

Professional employment experience

1. The following information must be provided:

- the dates of each period of employment (indicate full-time or part-time);
- the name, address and contact details of the employer;
- the nature of the business;
- your job title;
- detailed description of duties performed.

2. Applicants must provide evidence to support their claim of professional employment experience. For example:

- contract of employment;
- sample payslips;
- taxation documents, etc.

3. Applicants must also provide:

- a separate sheet summarising what supporting evidence is attached for each period of employment. Processing of your application will be delayed if this is not included
- two written and signed references from past or present veterinary employers. References must be written on the official letterhead of the person, company or government department providing the reference. Indicate clearly on the letterhead the full address of the person or company, any telephone and fax numbers, and email and website addresses. They must have the name and position of the person who signs the reference typed or stamped below that person's signature.

Completion of a PhD qualification

- Provide a certified copy of your post graduate qualification (PhD) in the original language and translation if required.
- Provide a full academic transcript from the institution.

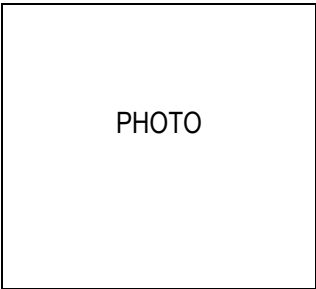
